## Ms. Janet Gray



Janet is currently providing dental technical consultant services for the Saskatchewan Ministry of Health and the three northern health regions. Janet began her public health dental career as an uncertified dental assistant for the

Saskatchewan Dental Plan in 1974. She later completed her education in both dental nursing (therapy) in 1977 and dental hygiene in 1996.

Upon graduation from Dental Therapy at Wascana Institute of Applied Arts and Sciences, Janet worked with the Saskatchewan Dental Plan in Saskatoon for two years and then moved to LaRonge where she currently resides and has worked for the past 37 years.

Janet has chaired and co-chaired the Northern Oral Health Working Group since its formation in 2003. Janet has been an active member and has held many executive positions within the Saskatchewan Dental Therapy and Hygiene Associations, the Canadian Association of Public Health Dentistry, and the Federal/Provincial/Territorial Dental Working Group. Janet was a member of the Canadian Academy of Health Sciences panel through to the completion of the document "Improving Access to Oral Health Care for Canadians."

## Dr. Alyssa Hayes



Dr. Alyssa Hayes completed her dental training at the University of Sydney, Australia in 2006. Dr. Hayes then accepted a position with the New South Wales (NSW) government as a Dental Officer working in rural NSW. During

this Alyssa worked closely with dental therapists, dental assistants and students (both locally and foreign-trained) to deliver care to marginalized populations.

After several years working in Australia Dr. Hayes returned home to Canada to complete her Dental Public Health specialty training at the University of Toronto.

Alyssa's research focused on the economic impacts of oral health and oral health care. After graduation Alyssa remained active in the Community Dental Health Services Research Unit (CDHRSU) in Toronto and was the Dental Consultant for the Regional Municipality of York before accepting a position as Assistant Professor in the College of Dentistry at the University of Saskatchewan. Dr. Hayes is currently the President-elect of the Canadian Association of Public Health Dentistry.

## Dr. Gerry Uswak



Dr. Uswak is Dean of the University of Saskatchewan College of Dentistry and Associate Professor of Community Dentistry and Public Health.

Dr. Uswak received his Doctor of Dental Medicine degree from the University of Manitoba, his Master in Public Health from the University of North Carolina – Chapel Hill, and completed a residency in Dental Public Health with the North Carolina Division of Dental Health.

Dr. Uswak's research interests include oral health manpower planning and access to care barriers. Most recently Dr. Uswak completed the Pan-Territorial Oral Health Review, an assessment of oral health services in the Yukon, Northwest Territories and Nunavut.
